Dress Code – Version 1.1

Rationale

The Club seeks to promote the sport of golf and a range of social activities within an environment which is inclusive of a broad range of members and guests. The dress code assists in promoting the reputation of the club within the golfing and wider community in order to ensure that the Thaxted Park Golf Club a destination of choice.

Golf attire has altered throughout the decades, Thaxted Park strives to reflect the modern approach to golf attire, an approach to this being a standard for dress during competition hours (7am to 3pm each day) and a more relaxed, inclusive approach in the twilight hours each day (3pm to dusk).

Overview

Dress on the Course and on the Practice Green

Clothing is expected to be of a style commensurate with commercially available golf attire and footwear must be golf shoes, running shoes or similar. As a guiding principle, golf attire during competition rounds should be reflective of the attire seen in professional golf, as televised. These trends change over time but should be the benchmark.

The Board acknowledges the differences in patronage and expectation between competition and social golf at Thaxted Park Golf Club. As a progressive club, we strive to be inclusive and reflective of modern society and its benchmarks of attire.

To assist with this, golfing attire can be of a more relaxed standard after 3pm each day, to encourage patronage. Whilst there will still be standards, the mandatory elements of dress shorts and polos are not required during this period. Additionally, garments with any advertising slogans (except for discreet brand name and Club logos) are not permitted, and nor is blue denim.

Use of the golf facilities, namely the practice fairway, chipping green and practice putting green do not to comply with competition dress code standards, a relaxed attire will be sufficient in these situations.

Dress in the Sprig Bar and on the Terrace

Neat casual wear is encouraged.

Members and patrons attending the club and its facilities immediately after work are permitted to attend in their work attire where applicable.

Dress in The Park Restaurant


Neat casual wear is acceptable, unless specified otherwise by Club Management.
